This course provides an overview of modern cosmology. We will meet to discuss the expansion of the universe, redshifts, scientific models of the universe, cosmic microwave background, neutrinos, origin of elements in the universe, the early universe, cosmic inflation, as well as dark matter and energy. You will also be introduced to Einstein's special and general theory of relativity and their application to black holes.
