

Your final grade in the class is calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{HW Total}}{320} \times 50 + \frac{\text{Exam 1} + \text{Exam 2}}{120} = \text{Raw score}$$

Your raw score translates to a letter grade by the following curve (which did *not* change from the mid-semester curve)

92 and above	--- A
80-91	--- B
66-79	--- C
50-65	--- D
Below 50	--- F

Note: The raw score that the e-gradebook calculated may be off by a few tenths of a point to, in rare cases, a few points. This is because of the way e-gradebook calculates your grade. I checked them all individually and in no case does this make any difference to anyone's final letter grade, but feel free to double check, just to make sure.
